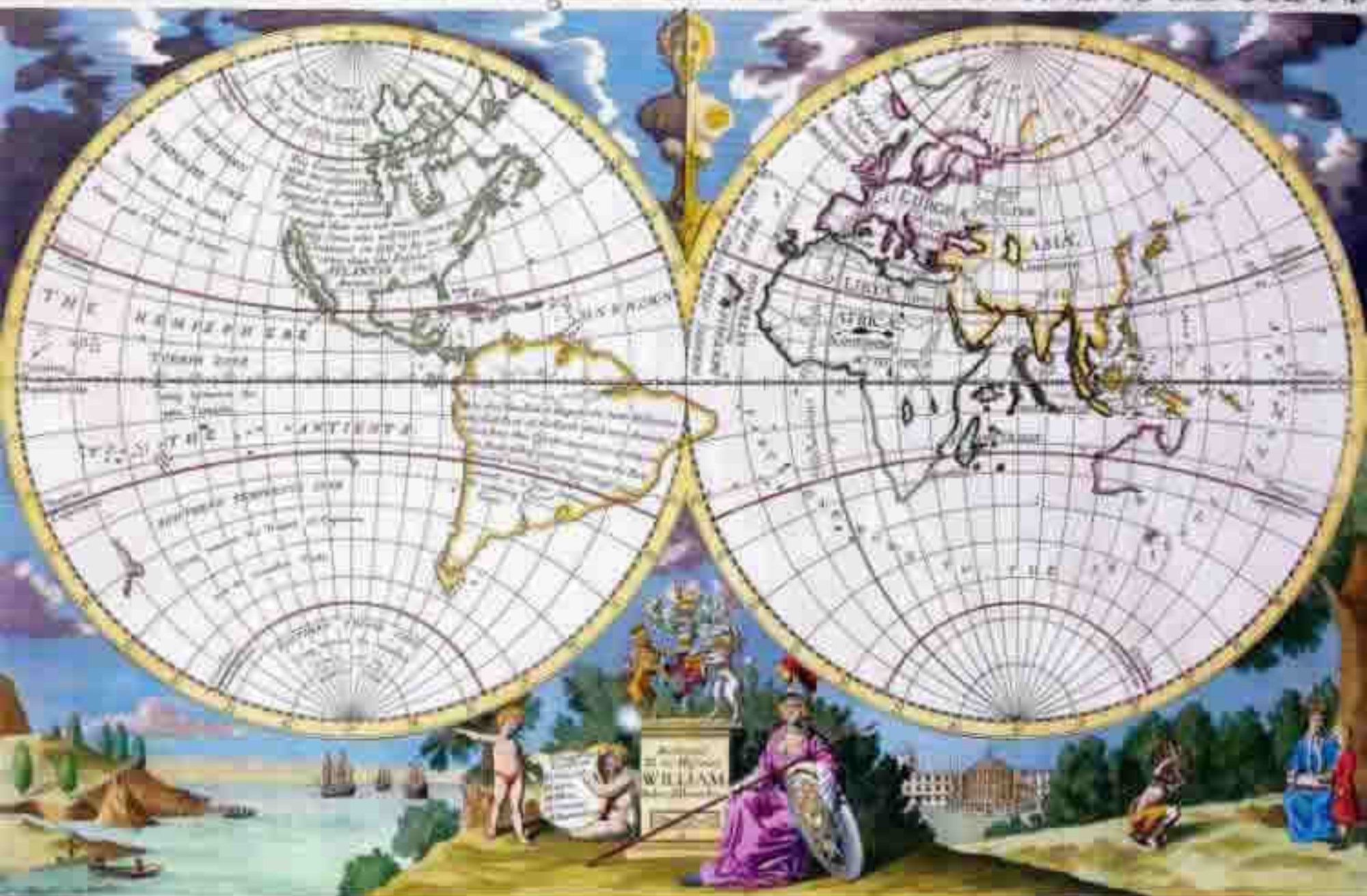
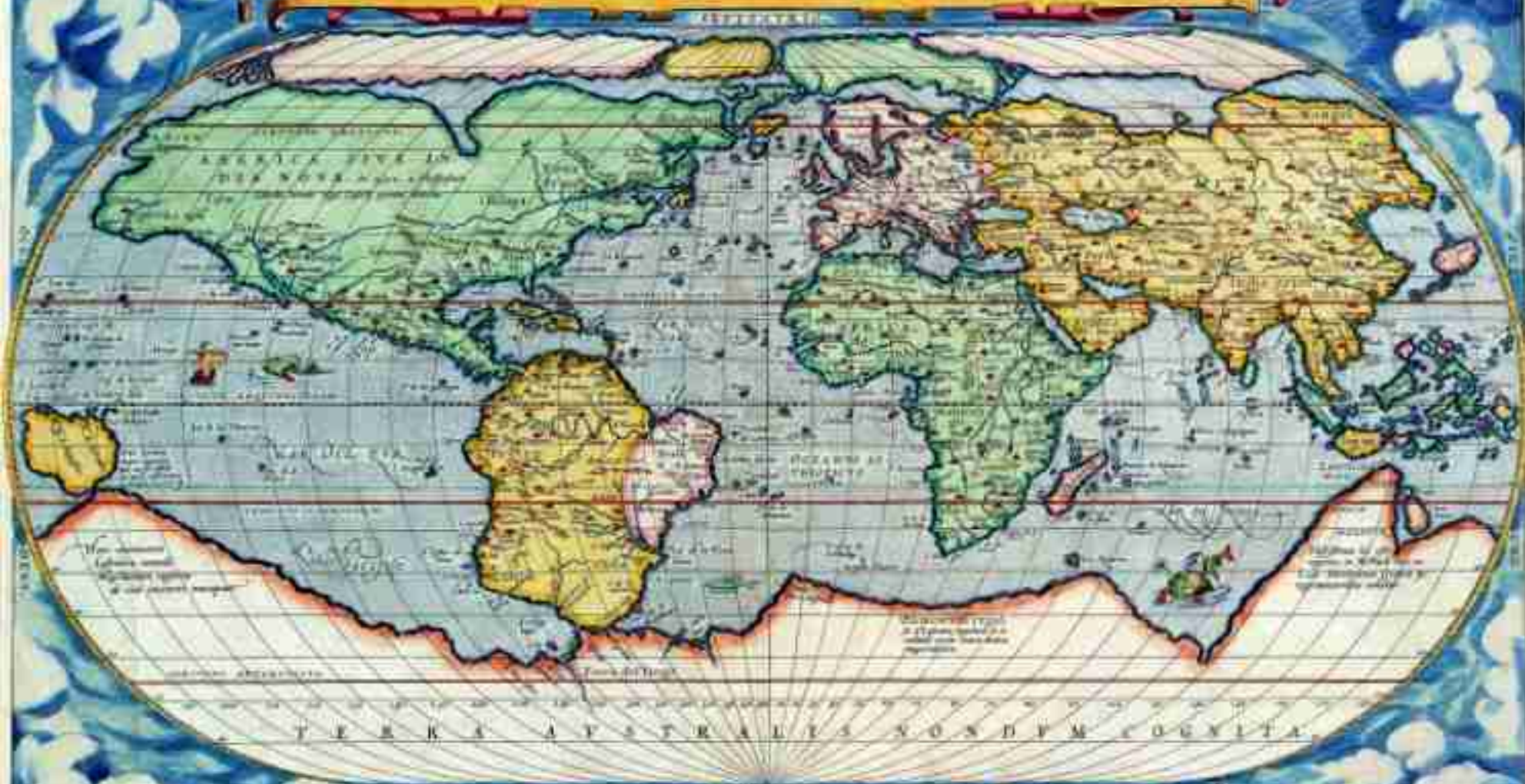
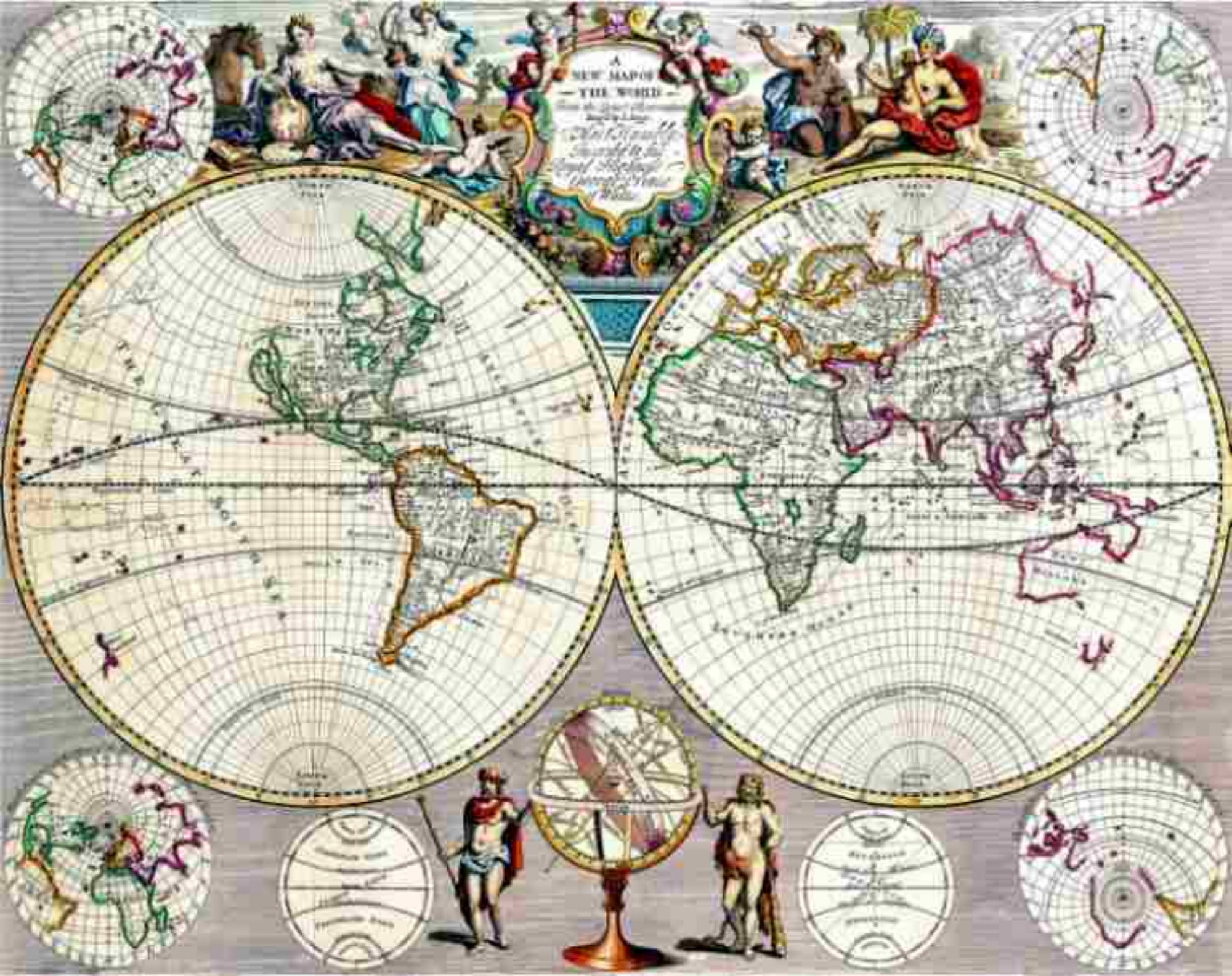


A NEW MAP of the TERRAQUEOUS GLOBE according
to the Ancient Discoveries and most general Divisions of it into CONTINENTS and OCEANS



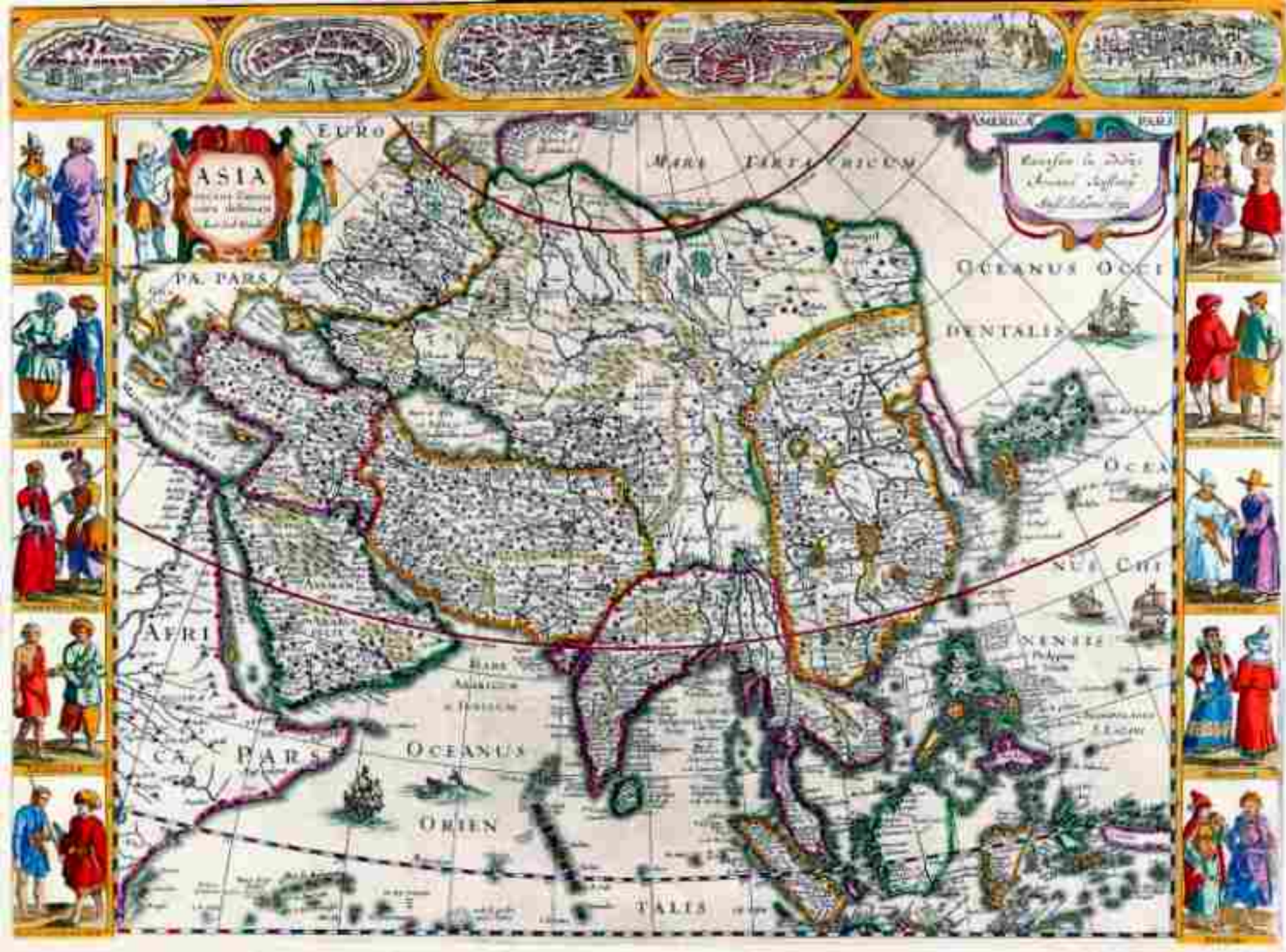

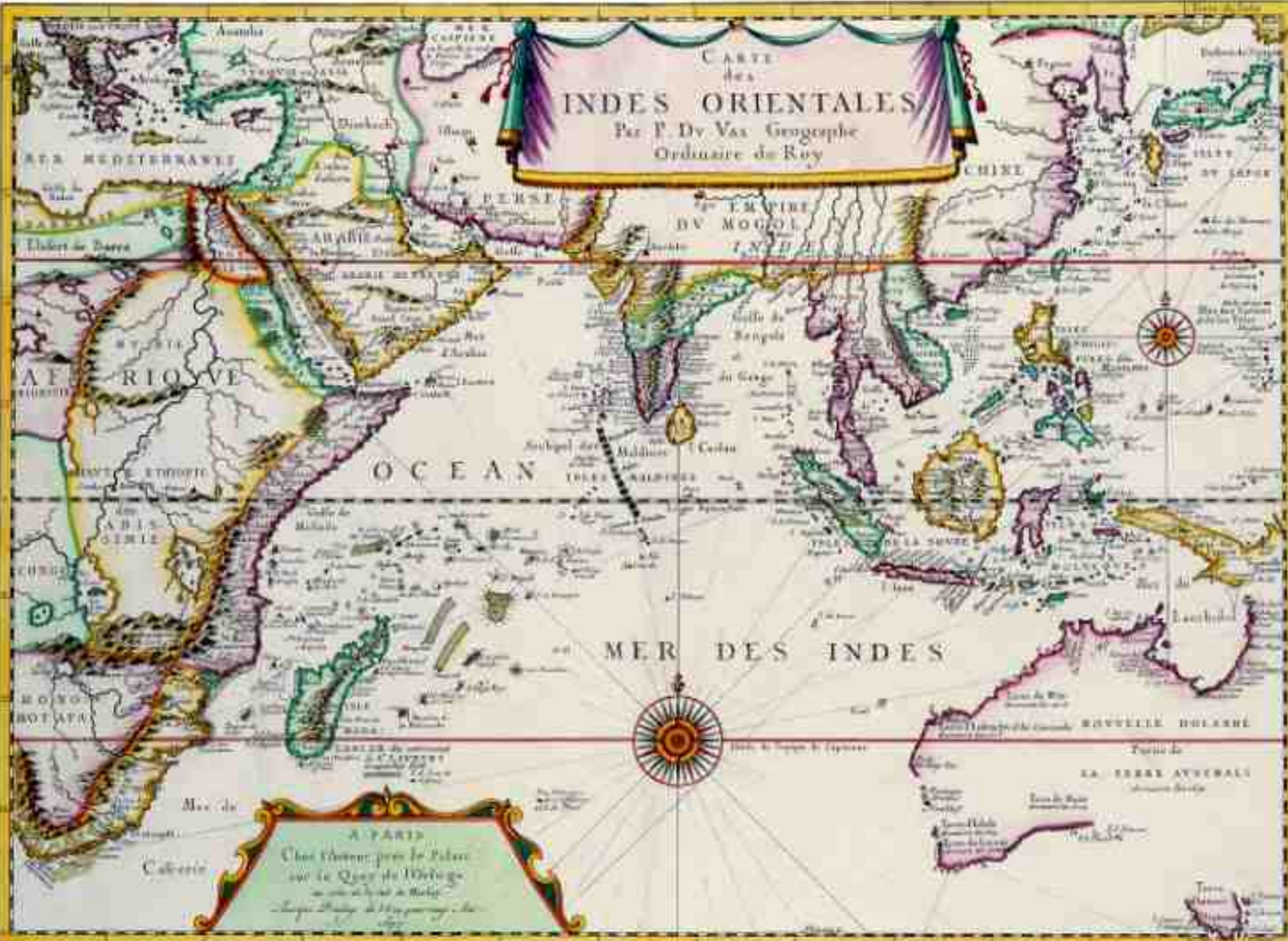

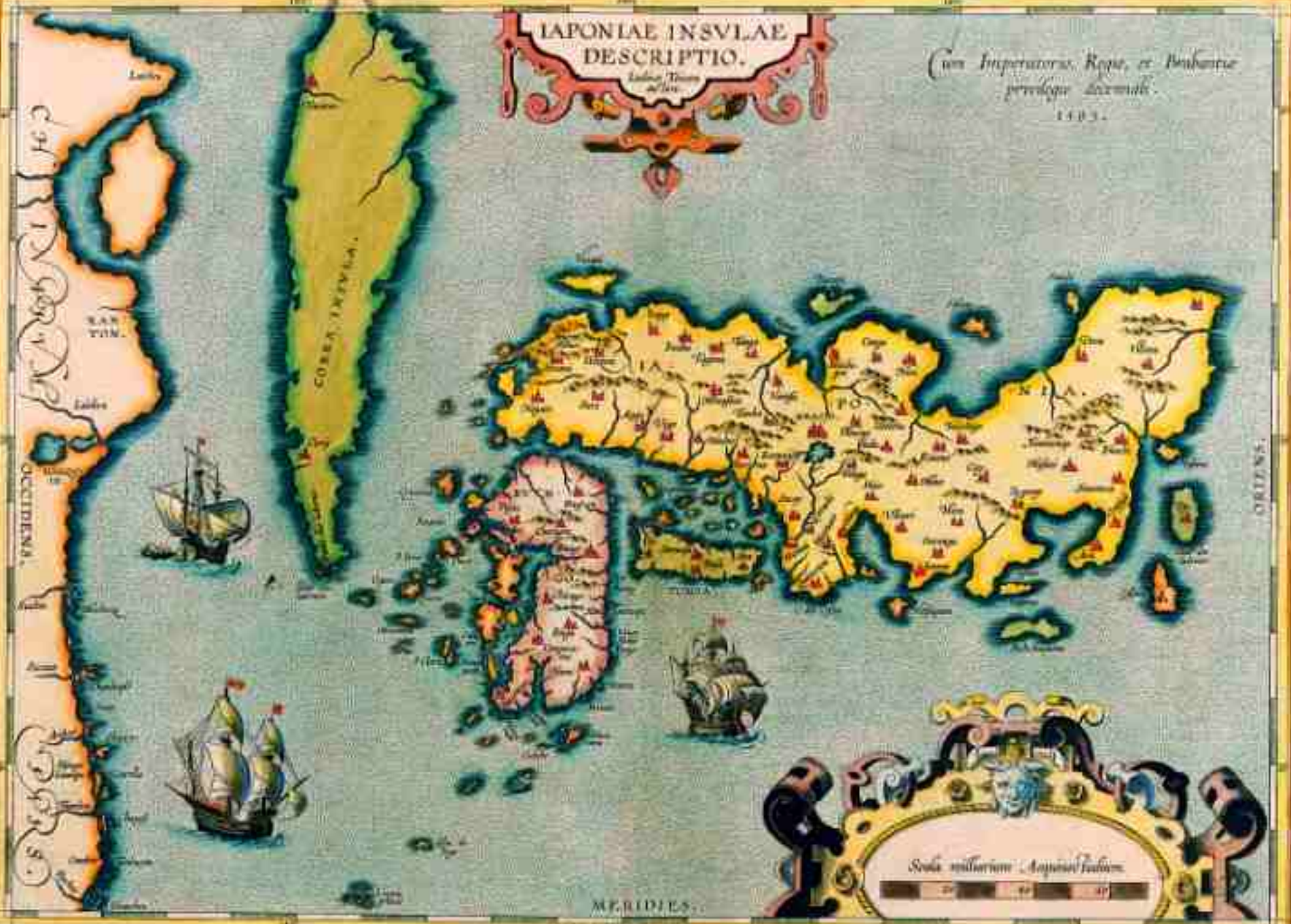
